Overview of NDARC

- National research centre in operation since 1987
- Australia's leading research group in the alcohol and other drugs sector
- Multi-disciplinary with national and international collaborators
- Sits within the Faculty of Medicine & Health, UNSW Sydney
- Funded by:
 - > Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care
 - UNSW Sydney



NDARC's mission

Generate evidence-based, multidisciplinary research that positively impacts strategies to address alcohol and other drug use and related harms



NDARC Core Research Areas

- Prevention and early intervention
- Clinical research
- Mental and physical comorbidities
- Epidemiology of drug and alcohol use and harms
- Justice health and drug policy
- Indigenous health and wellbeing
- Health economics and biostatistics
- Families and communities



NDARC Types of Research

- Surveillance of trends in use, markets and outcomes of substance use
- Systematic reviews of prevalence of use, risks of use, treatment and interventions
- Clinical trials of treatments and interventions
- Large cohort studies, including data linkage
- Evaluations of policy, practice, and services
- Economic analyses
- Qualitative research
- Other novel approaches (e.g., online monitoring)

NDARC HDR Program

- Administered through the School of Population Health, Faculty of Medicine & Health, UNSW Sydney
- Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) research program that demonstrates a significant and original contribution to knowledge in the field of study [3-4 years full-time]
- Masters by Research (MRes) as per PhD but shorter program and work is smaller in scope [1.5-2 years full-time]
- Master of Philosophy (MPhil) coursework + research thesis, provides a pathway to PhD program [1.5-2 years full-time]



UNSW PhD Admission

Degree requirements for entry into PhD:

- An appropriate UNSW Bachelor degree with upper second-class Honours; or
- Completed Masters by Research from UNSW; or
- An equivalent qualification from a tertiary institution

Minimum requirement for a UNSW PhD Scholarship:

 A four-year Bachelor's degree with Honours Class I from an Australian institution or equivalent research qualification experience. Qualification must be in a field relevant to the proposed area of research.



NDARC HDR Program

- 1. 3-4 year drug and alcohol research project
- 2. NDARC HDR Training and Development Program
- 3. UNSW HDR Resources and Training Opportunities
- 4. Access to other NDARC, Faculty and UNSW resources
- 5. Option for paid casual or part-time employment on NDARC projects



NDARC HDR Training & Development Program

- Peer-led program that offers tailored and bespoke seminars and training sessions to support HDR candidates
- HDR Group offers daily co-working writing sessions, monthly meetings and training sessions
- Examples of topics covered:
 - ➤ Thesis writing
 - > Literature reviews and database searches
 - ➤ Statistical analysis
 - ➤ Career planning
 - ➤ Presentation skills

- Propose own or select from current project opportunities:
 - > Understanding and preventing substance-related deaths in Australia
 - Awareness of, and responses to, drug alerts about higher-risk substances
 - > Quantifying pharmaceutical misuse and harms among older adults
 - Quantifying risks of methamphetamine dependence & interventions to reduce harm
 - Perspectives of treatment and support for people who are drug dependent and their families



Find a project

- Propose own or select from current project opportunities:
 - Investigating the risk of harm from prescription opioids using linked data
 - Text-message support for smoking cession about low-socioeconomic status smokers
 - > Use and safety of prescription drugs of dependence during pregnancy
 - Cost-benefits of Aboriginal residential rehabilitation for substance use treatment
 - Evaluating the impact of drug checking ("pill testing") services in Australia

Domestic Research Scholarships

- National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) Postgraduate Scholarship
- Australian Government Research Training Program (RTP)
 Scholarship
- University Postgraduate Award (UPA)
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Research Training Program Scholarships



NDARC HDR Scholarships

- Competitive scholarship stipend and support package:
 - > Stipend: \$35,000 per annum, tax-exempt
 - > \$10,000 for professional development activities
 - > \$5,000 for associated research costs
- PhD scholarships are for three years (6-month extension possible)
- MRes and MPhil scholarships are for two years



NDARC HDR Scholarship Eligibility

- Meet UNSW requirements for enrolment in HDR Program
- Meet residency and visa requirements
- Have applied or an in the process of applying for an externallyfunded HDR scholarship



NDARC Scholarship Application Process

- 1. Assess eligibility to enrol in a UNSW HDR Program
- 2. Identify a suitable supervisor
- 3. Identify or propose a research topic area of interest
- 4. Prepare application form, provide supporting documents, inc. evidence of externally-funded HDR Scholarship application
- 5. Short-listed applicants are invited for an interview

HDR Research Proposal

- 3-5 pages outlining your proposed area of study:
 - 1. Project title
 - 2. Background/rationale
 - 3. Aims
 - 4. Proposed research design
 - 5. Anticipated outcomes/significance
 - 6. Timeframe
 - 7. References



NDARC Scholarship Application Deadlines

- Applications close: Midnight, Sunday 13th November
- Interviews: Applicants must be available for interview during the week of November 21-25, 2022
- Program start: Applicants can commence in any 2023 term of UNSW Sydney's HDR academic calendar


