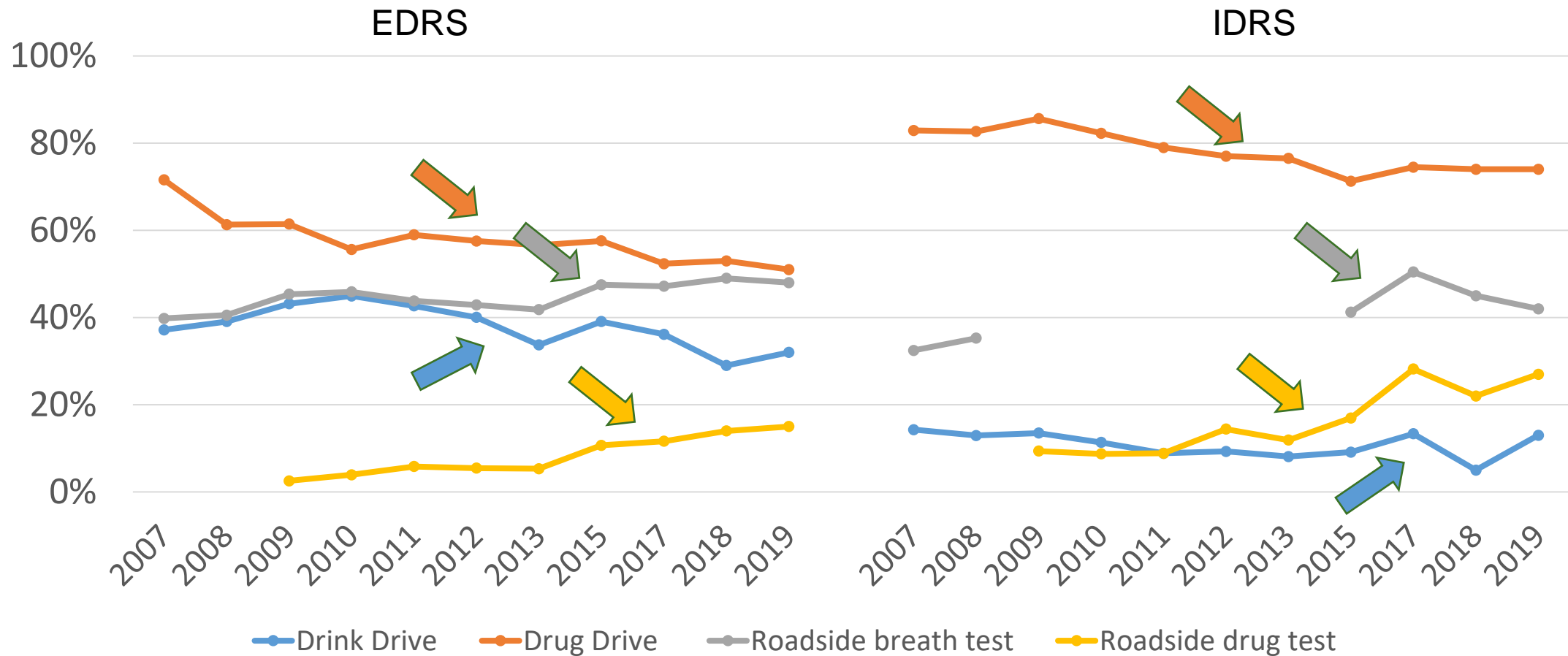




Background

- Driving under the influence (DUI) following alcohol or illicit drug use is a potential road safety risk.
- Roadside breath testing (RBT) and roadside drug testing (RDT) was introduced in Australia to deter driving under the influence.
- We used interview data from two sentinel samples: EDRS and IDRS to present trends in DUI.

Past 6 months driving under the influence of drugs and driving over the legal limit for alcohol, roadside breath and drug testing among recent drivers.





To conclude...

- Increased exposure to RDT and RBT among EDRS and IDRS samples.
- Possible deterrent effect among the EDRS sample.
